SHOO YOU CROCODILE!

Self-guided trail

Follow the children from *Shoo You Crocodile* and go on your own adventure around the South Australian Museum. Will you see a crocodile?

Main Foyer – G

Let's look for crocodiles!

What can you see? If you have the book, let's compare. What might be different?

Where are the turtle and whale skeletons? Which is which?

Did you spot the meteorite?

What else can you see?

World Mammals – G

Can you find all the animals on this page? Which animal now has a baby?

There's no crocodile in here today. What other animals have sharp teeth?

Where is the elephant? Can you find the tiger?

What sounds do they make?

How long can you stand on one leg like a flamingo?

Biodiversity Gallery – L2

No crocodiles here today either. But there is a Perentie, the biggest lizard in Australia! Where is it?

What else is here? Can you find:

- 10 lizards
- 8 crabs
- 6 snakes
- 4 turtles
- 2 frogs

Can you put your arms out wide like the pelican's wings?

Jump like the big red kangaroo?

Can you chomp your teeth like the great white shark?

Minerals and Megafauna – L3

Still no crocodiles!

But can you see some megafauna bones?
How do you think these huge animals would have moved?

There's also a space suit! What would you look like if you were walking on the moon?

Moon walk past the meteorites to see the mineral wall. Which colour is your favourite?

Opal Fossils Gallery – L3

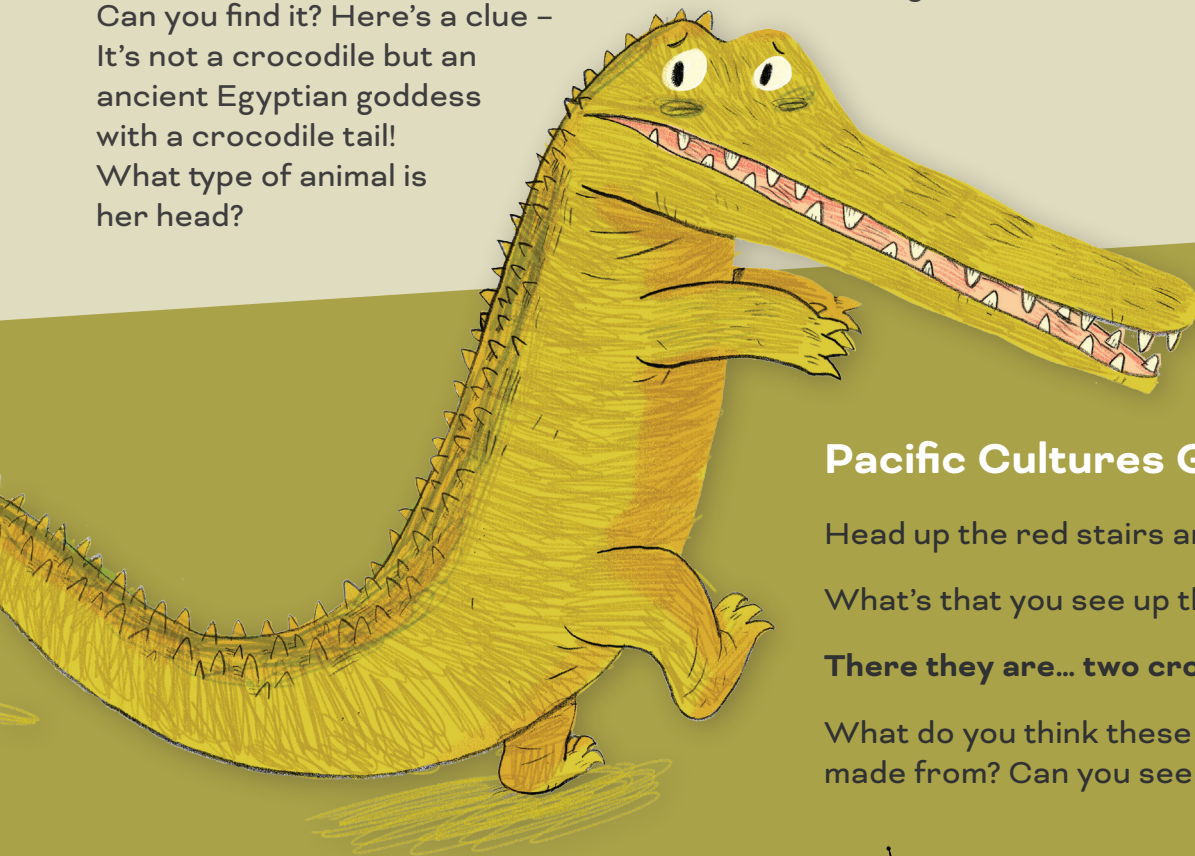
Here we have a Plesiosaur, a giant swimming reptile. Plesiosaurs lived long ago in the time of dinosaurs. Can you move your hands and feet like flippers?

Can you curl into a spiral like a cowrie shell?
Wiggle your fingers like tentacles.

Ancient Egypt – L3

Into the Egyptian room, and maybe we can find a crocodile here, or at least its tail...

Can you find it? Here's a clue –
It's not a crocodile but an ancient Egyptian goddess with a crocodile tail!
What type of animal is her head?



Top of the giant squid – L3

Look up and see the sperm whale, it eats giant squid!

Look down at the giant squid. Move your arms like squid tentacles.

Follow the giant squid all the way down to the ground floor. What other swimming animals can you see?

Australian Aboriginal Cultures Gallery – L2/L1

Walking through the Australian Aboriginal Cultures Gallery – **if you look closely you might spot some pictures of crocodiles here.**

Where can you see them? You might find some other animals too!

Can you find Kondoli the whale?
There is a special story about him from the Ngarrindjeri people. You can find it on the sign under Kondoli.

Pacific Cultures Gallery – M

Head up the red stairs and look way up high!

What's that you see up there?

There they are... two crocodiles!

What do you think these crocodiles are made from? Can you see their teeth?
