The didjeridu is the iconic sound of Australia. From a stringybark forest in Arnhem Land to the concert halls of Europe, the sound of yidaki (didjeridu) speaks of the landscapes and cultures of Australia and its First People.

A collaboration between the South Australian Museum and the Yolngu people, this special exhibition explores yidaki through sound, story, moving image and rarely seen treasures from the South Australian Museum's collection.

Kids see the exhibition FREE when accompanied by an adult during the school holiday program.
